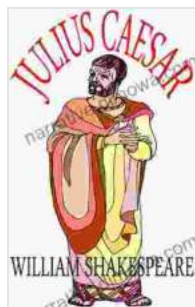

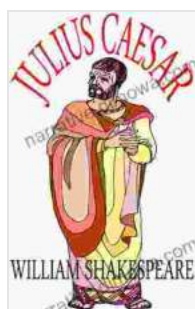

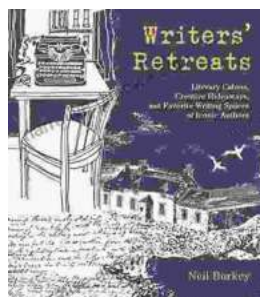

Julius Caesar by Andros

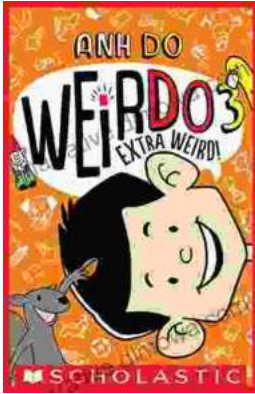
